is to promote economic growth, strengthen governance, and improve results for urban residents.

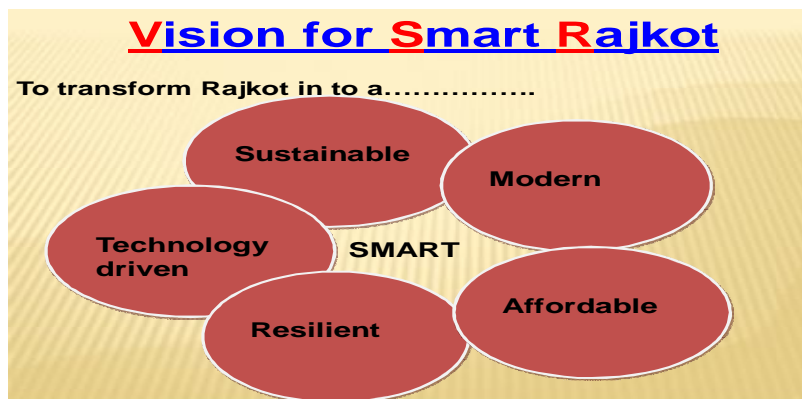
